I am proud to announce that every HCHS athletic team has been recognized as Academic All-State for the 15-16 school year! To be recognized as Academic All-State, the grade point average of every team member must average 3.0. Although a 3.0 grade point average may not seem like a lofty number to achieve, team Academic All-State Awards is not all that common. Every Rancher team for the past 6 years has achieved this award. It is also important to report that every Rancher team GPA was well over the 3.0 mark with the lowest Rancher team GPA being 3.20 for the 15-16 school year. Schools are required to track attendance of every child, in every classroom, everyday. The state of South Dakota requires schools to hit a certain percentage of daily attendance and that number hovers around 94%.
