20-120 Preliminary Budget. Supt. Page reviewed a very preliminary budget with the board for the 2020-21 school year. As bills are finalized in the state legislature, everything will become more precise. There is also discussion about transferring from the alternative funding formula to the Blue-Ribbon funding formula as it may be more beneficial to the district. This will continue to be researched.

Open Forum: Laurie Elmore shared with the board that she is the new Camp Crook PTO president.

Thanks also to the Harding County and Bison AAU groups for doing a great job of cleaning up after the district AAU event. It is much appreciated.

20-121 Calendar. March 17, 2020 is the Region History Day event held at Harding County School. There will be an additional 150 students at the school that day. Motion by Johnson, second by Gilbert to cancel classes for High School and Middle School on Tuesday, March 17, 2020. Motion carried. Elementary and rural schools will continue to have classes.

20-122 NWAS Report. Randy Routier gave the NWAS report. The budget was discussed for next school year. Two vehicles were replaced this month.

20-123 Maintenance. The maintenance report was discussed. Watson attended the town board meeting to discuss the ditch drainage. The school will be looking into adding additional gravel for the parking lot and blading it, as well as possibly replacing the old John Deere lawnmower this summer.

20-124 Business Manager. Henderson gave the Business Manager report. The school is now accepting online food service payments through Infinite Campus. Those with questions can contact the school office.

20-125 K-12 Principal Report. Principal Messmer gave his report. Smarter Balanced testing will begin later this month. Congrats to Sam Adams for placing 5th at state wrestling, and to the Girls and Boys Basketball teams on finishing strong this season.
